About Today's Bible Readings

2 SAMUEL 5:1-3

The people ask David to be their king. He is one of them but God has granted him the gifts of leadership.

Responsorial Psalm: 122:1-2, 3-4, 4-5

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

COLOSSIANS 1:12-20

These words, first addressed to the early church, supply us with countless motifs for our praise of Jesus who is the fullness of redemption.

LUKE 23:35-43

Even as he dies, Jesus exercises the power of his love, showing the qualities that make him our eternal Lord and Savior.

ENTRANCE RITE - Sirach 18:3; Psalms 22:28-29

- V. The Lord guides the world with a turn of His hand, and all things obey His will. For He is King of all, and by His power He separates what is holy from what is not.
- R. All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord; All the families of the nations shall bow down before Him. For dominion is the Lord's, and He rules the nations.

THE GOSPEL – LUKE 23:35-43

The rulers sneered at Jesus and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews."

Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

When the season of Advent arrives, here are some changes that people often notice in Church. Probably the most obvious of these is that the color of the vestments changes to violet or blue. On the Third Sunday of Advent, which is also called Gaudete Sunday, as the Advent season is already half over, the joy of the Nativity begins to break in and on that day rose colored vestments may be used. Also, the hymn Glory to God in the highest is omitted at Mass, and one will find that there is a certain moderation in the decoration of the altar. While flowers may still be used, the decoration of the altar should not express the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord.
