The Fourth Sunday of Advent

A Sabbath Thought

Like Joseph, our role in the drama of Christmas, the drama of redemption for everyone, demands our openness to unusual options. What about angels, what about visions and dreams?

About Today's Bible Readings

ISAIAH 7:10-14

Ahaz says he does not want to trouble the Lord with his business, but he is lying. He hopes God will let him handle things in his own way. But God intervenes anyway.

Responsorial Psalm: 24:1-2, 3-4, 5-6

R. Let the Lord enter; he is king of glory.

ROMANS 1:1-7

Paul writes to fellow Christians he has not met and urges them to be obedient ("listen") to the call that they have received to "spread the Name".

MATTHEW 1:18-24

Joseph, not often at center stage in the Christmas story, shares his fears with an angel in a dream. He finds his options enlarged and receives an invitation to name the future of salvation.

ENTRANCE RITE – John 11:27; Psalm 90:2

- V. Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that You are the Messiah, the Son of God, the One Who is coming into the world.
- R. Before the mountains were born, the earth and the world brought forth, from eternity to eternity You are God.
- V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
- R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

ALLELUIA – Revelation 22:16

I, Jesus, sent My angel to give you this testimony for the churches. I am the root and offspring of David, the bright morning star.

THE GOSPEL – Matthew 1:18-24

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home.

This is the Gospel of the Lord!
