THE GOSPEL: - John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb.

So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him."

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb.

They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in.

When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise be to You Lord Jesus Christ.

REFLECTION

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia, Alleluia!

Today we rejoice for our Lord is Risen as He said. Although we cannot gather in our church buildings to celebrate this great and most important day – we the Church sing and shout out with great joy: Christ the Lord is Risen Today! As we continue to face these anxious days with the spread of the virus, sickness and death we know that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ has conquered this through His Resurrection.

In rising from the dead, He is victorious over sin and death and He has shown us that way for He is the Way the Truth and Life. Jesus tells us "I am the Resurrection and the Life"! Today we know how true this is and it is in our Lord's Resurrection that even in these times of pandemic where we find hope, solace, peace and comfort.

That Easter morn changed the world forever. For our Lord lives and is here with us, with His Church to lead and guide us on that way to life in His Kingdom where the pains, sorrows, sickness and death of this world will be washed away. Let us give thanks and praise to God for sending His Son into the world not to condemn us but that we might have life in Him.

As the Resurrection transformed the disciples from fearing for their lives to giving them in service to our Lord and needs of others. May we do the same – may the power and presence of our Crucified and Resurrected Lord transform us and allows us, by how we live as His disciples, to transform our communities and our world! (A *few moments for silent reflection*)

NICENE CREED

I come to You, Lord, in this time of uncertainty and confusion that has gripped our nation. I pray that our leaders and representatives in government are filled with Your peace, strength and courage. By their belief and trust in You may they provide capable leadership, promote unity and peace, and be attentive to the concerns of our people. May Your Church provide support and comfort; and help strengthen our hope for peace through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.
