

EZEKIEL 18:25-28

There is a basic logic to God's justice. The Lord meets in mercy the human beings who truthfully confess their evil.

PHILIPPIANS 2:1-11

Jesus is Lord, in spite of everything; indeed, *because* of everything. We must honor him.
