

About Today's Bible Readings

ACTS 13:14, 43-52

Easter joy should not be an *annual* thing but rather a daily experience. As in the early church, we of the current church should know every day the fullness of joy in the Spirit.

What is Easter all about? John's vision attempts to answer our question: Easter life is about fulfillment, the state of lacking nothing because God will be everything to us.
