#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

On Sunday, May 21, 2023, the Polish American Board of Education of Berks County will be awarding \$17,000 in scholarships to Berks County High School seniors of Polish American descent. Deadline for submitting the form for this scholarship is April 1, 2023.

In conjunction with the PABEBC scholarship awards program, the Polish American Heritage Association of Berks County is awarding a \$2,500 project scholarship to a Berks County high school student of Polish American descent. For this scholarship, the student is required to submit a project on Polish history, culture, and/or traditions. Projects are due on Sunday March 19, 2023.

Applicants for the scholarships can obtain application forms and guidelines in the office of the Guidance Counselor in all Berks County high schools.
