Second Sunday of Lent

A Sabbath Thought

From the depths of last Sunday's desert, we climb today's mountain of the transfiguration. The glory that beams from the transformed Jesus lights our way.

About Today's Bible Readings

GENESIS 12:1-4

Abraham, our ancestor in the faith, began his journey with God by letting go of all that was comforting and familiar to him.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22.

R: Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

2 TIMOTHY 1:8-10

We whom God has blessed with a legacy of Abraham are, like the patriarch of old, called to a journey of faith that will lead us through death to life.

MATTHEW 17:1-9

More light than we can bear shines through the transfigured Jesus, a testimony to God's favor, an invitation to our faith, a guarantee of our salvation.

ENTRANCE RITE - Philippians 3:9

- V. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the righteousness of my own based on the law,
- R. But that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God, depending on faith.
- V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
- R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

TRACT - James 2:14, 17, 24 26b

- V. What good is it my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead.
- R. See how a person is justified by works and not by faith alone. So also faith without works is dead.

THE GOSPEL - Matthew 17:1-9

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone.

As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

This is the Gospel of the Lord!
