About Today's Bible Readings

JONAH 3:1-5, 10

Jonah teaches the Lord's call to repentance and the people of Nineveh respond immediately.

Responsorial Psalm 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9

R: Teach me your ways, O Lord.

1 CORINTHIANS 7:29-31

When he wrote these words, Paul believed the Lord's coming was imminent. Therefore, he urges detachment from this world as a preparation for the life to come.

MARK 1:14-20

Jesus takes over the mission and message of John the Baptist. Therefore He preaches repentance and He chooses disciples.

ENTRANCE RITE: Matthew 12:21, Acts 3:19-20a

- V. At the judgment, the men of Nineveh will arise with this generation and condemn it, because they repented at the preaching of Jonah; and there is something greater than Jonah here.
- R. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away, and that the Lord may grant you times of refreshment.

THE GOSPEL: MARK 1:14-20

As he passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Then they abandoned their nets and followed him. He walked along a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They too were in a boat mending their nets. Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him.
