#### Annual Parish Meeting

### Parish Approves 2025 Agenda, No Major Changes...

On Sunday, January 26, the St. Stephen the Martyr Parish held its annual membership meeting, and the event was very productive, yet largely uneventful. That is, lacking in controversy.

Following the usual agenda of parish reports from Fr. Sr. Donald E. Wunderlich, and various other parish organizations, these are the highlights of the topics that were discussed:

■ Annual Picnic: Improving the financial breakdown of picnic income and expenses will be a priority, especially regarding donations, etc.

It was noted that a lot of help will be needed again this year with food prep for the picnic and in the kitchen at the picnic grove.

A fund-raiser is being considered to purchase new light-weight folding tables for picnic use.

- Finances of the church will also be evaluated with the goal of getting out of the "red."
- Kevin Grossman is researching what needs to be done regarding the painting of the altars. He

noted that they may need to be checked for lead paint. Then, determine what needs to be done.

- Regarding building matters, the refrigerator in the kitchen needs to be repaired. It is not working. The service call is scheduled. Toilets in the building are being checked and replaced where needed.
- St. Stephen's will mark its 100th Anniversary in 2027. An Anniversary Committee was established. The members are: Jay Rowe, chair; Janet Katinowsky; Ned Kotula; Janet Reed; Mike Traczuk; Sally Traczuk and Carol Urban. Ned Kotula is still looking for church related memorabilia.
- School of Christian Living now has three students, as reported by Janet Katinwosky.
- MISC. NEWS: New financial contribution system seems to be working. New parish members were welcomed. Joe Dowd II added to Parish Committee as a trustee. Rebecca Kotula was recognized as she will be attending law school. Also, Kevin Grossman for all the work he has done for parish.



Message from Fr. Sr.

The Polish word "Kolędy" actually has two meanings. The word "Kolędy" is translated into English to mean Christmas Carols. They are often religious songs that are sung in church or in the home. They are simple and pure, and are sometimes described as being both prayers and musical dramas.

Kolędy may also refer to a Polish Catholic custom where priests visit parishioners' homes after Epiphany. During these visits, the priest blesses the homes and write "20 K+M+B+25" on the main entrance door.

The message, written in chalk above the door includes the year, three crosses, and the initials of the three kings in Polish. They are Kacper, Melchior, and Baltazar. They are the Polish names for the three wise men who visited baby Jesus, also known as Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.

The priest may also offer pastoral remarks at this time.

The blessing is a way to protect the home's inhabitants from misfortune, and is a chance for the priest to see how parishioners are living and to invite lapsed parishioners back to the church.

In order to prepare for a house blessing, place a lighted candle, an icon of Christ, and a bowl to hold holy water on your dining room table or family altar. You may also have a prayer list ready.

I look forward to visiting your homes during this special season.

#### **Annual Parish Picnic**

## Plans Begin for 2025 Event, Food Prep Priority

The Picnic Committee met Sunday, February 2, and immediately set in to motion its plans for this year's festivities.

Jay Rowe, picnic committee chairperson, set the agenda for the meeting, and reported that several key areas have already been established. They are: the band (booked), Willow Glen Park (reserved), and the beer wagon (reserved).

Critical to the success of the picnic, of course, is the food-preparation, and that was the main focus of the meeting. The committee established tentative dates for pierogi-making. They are as follows: March 14 & 15, March 28 & 29 (Potato); April 11 & 12 (Potato); April 25 & 26 (Cheese); May 9 & 10 (Cheese), May 30-31 (Cheese); Sauerkraut-to be determined. A sign-up sheet will be available in the vestibule for volunteers.

It was also noted that an attempt will be made to cut-back on the amount produced at these sessions in order to make the day's work more manageable. For example, instead of making 140+ dozen, we would try to cut it back to 100 dozen.

The point was made that we need to pay special attention to the sizes of the scoops used to portion the fillings, and adjust the recipe to suit the quantity of pierogies to be produced.

The committee also addressed concerns over the production of golumpki, this year. Since the

issue of golumpki-making may be a problem, Tom Schalata agreed to check with Shady Maple to see if we could purchase the filled cabbages from them. This was done two years ago when most of our's were lost due to a problem with the freezer in which the product was stored. More than half of our inventory was spoiled from the incident.

It was also suggested that the flyers for this year's picnic be ready to go by spring.

Finally, it was stressed that promotion of the picnic would be more important than ever, since the event was switching from a traditional Sunday date to Saturday, in order to avoid the conflict with the ongoing flea market at the grounds.

Over the last few years during the Lenten Season, the Stations of the Cross Service have been held on Wednesday's at 7 pm. On those evenings, at 6 pm, several St. Stephen's organizations and/or family members have sponsored a free Lenten Meal in the Fellowship Hall.

This year we are looking for organizations or individuals to sign up to supply one of those meals. Typically, about 20 to 30 people turn out for the Wednesday meals, but occassionally, we've had about 35 or so, depending in the weather, scheduling, etc.

The practice has actually become quite popular, and Fr. Sr. Don reports that it has helped to increase attendence for services on those nights.

In the past, this weekly Lenten Meal

#### Kielbasa Potato Bean Soup

1 pound smoked kielbasa, sliced

8 average potatoes, peeled and cubed

2 cups canned beans (navy or your choice)

2 cups chicken broth

2 sticks celery sliced

1/4 cup sliced carrot

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

1/2 teaspoon onion powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper

1 & 1/2 cups whole milk plus 1/2 stick butter

2/3 cup shredded cheddar cheese

Cook kielbasa until browned, set aside. add potatoes, beans, broth, celery and carrots to a pot, add seasonings and bring to a boil then cook on low for about 15 mins until potatoes are soft. Add the milk cheese and kielbasa and cook on low for another 15 minutes then serve. Must we say enjoy with crusty bread or rye bread and butter?
