# About Today's Bible Readings

#### **JEREMIAH 17:5-8**

Dry bushes, dry hearts - they are all the same, says the prophet. What is needed is the water of compassion.

#### RESPONSORIAL PSALM 1:1-2, 3, 4 AND 6

# R. Blessed are they who hope in the Lord.

#### 1 CORINTHIANS 15:12, 16-20

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the cardinal point of history. We must, therefore, make it a linchpin of our lives.

#### **LUKE 6:17, 20-26**

In a series of blessings and curses, Jesus delineates our options: If you give, you win; if you take, you lose.

#### **ENTRANCE RITE – Psalm 1:1-3**

- V. Happy those who do not follow the counsel of the wicked, Nor go the way of sinners, nor sit in company with scoffers. Rather, the law of the Lord is their joy; God's law they study day and night.
- R. They are like a tree planted near streams of water, that yields its fruit in due season; Its leaves never wither; whatever they do prospers.
- V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
- R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

### TRACT: Psalm 84:12-13 (recited in place of the Alleluia)

- V. The Lord withholds no good thing from those who walk without reproach.
- R. O Lord of hosts, happy are those who trust in You.

## THE GOSPEL - Luke 6:17, 20-26

Jesus came down with the twelve and stood on a stretch of level ground with a great crowd of his disciples and a large number of the people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon. And raising his eyes toward his disciples he said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours." Blessed are you who are now hungry, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold, your reward will be great in heaven. For their ancestors treated the prophets in the same way. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are filled now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who laugh now, for you will grieve and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for their ancestors treated the false prophets in this way."
